from the Lord,

of Mercy;
you who live and reign
with the Father and the Holy
Spirit for ever
And ever.

7. St. Paul's Church and
the Shrine of Divine
Mercy, *Sauk Centre*
8. Assumption (Grasshopper)
Chapel, *Cold Spring*
